English Reading Lesson

Total time: 1 hour 30 minutes

Goal

After the lesson, students will be able to skim and scan reading materials successfully.

Objectives

After the lesson, students will be able to:

- i. extract relevant information from a text
- ii. scan for information using cueing prompts from questions
- iii. scan extended texts for key factual information
- iv. understand limitations of scanning
- v. use a range of reading strategies
- vi. identify question words
- vii. understand point of view

Intended Learning Outcomes:

After this lesson, students will be able to:

- a) scan for key information
- b) skim for general meaning of a text
- c) understand a text and make sense of it by recognizing familiar words
- d) use question words to scan for information
- e) use scanning to quickly find surface information
- f) understand point of view
- g) produce cohesive written discourse

Passage 1

Pre-reading Activity

(Time: 5 minutes)

Have the students discuss the following questions before reading the passage:

- 1. What is your favorite meal/dish?
- 2. Can you associate this dish to a fond/bitter memory from your childhood?

While Reading Activity

(Time: 10 minutes)

Have the students discuss the following questions as they read the passage:

- 1. How many characters are there in this passage? Figure out who is narrating.
- 2. What is the relevance of xôi to the scene of the passage?

Read the following passage and complete all the post reading activities.

Xôi and Jennifer

[Xôi is a sweet or savory Vietnamese dish made from sticky rice and other ingredients.]

A young couple entered the restaurant in Andy's view. They were holding hands. Andy sat back down in his chair. He felt sick. He turned and faced his father, who was eating xôi.

"What's the matter, son?" asked his father. "I thought you were going to the birthday party."

"It's too late."

"Are you sure?"

Andy nodded. He looked at the plate of xôi. He wanted to bury his face in it. "Hi, Andy." A voice came from behind.

Andy looked up. He recognized the beautiful face, and he refused to meet her eyes. "Hi, Jennifer," <u>muttered</u> Andy, looking at the floor.



"You didn't miss much, Andy. The party was dead. I was looking for you, hoping you could give me a ride home. Then I met Tim, and he was bored like me. And he said he'd take me home.... Andy, do you want to eat with us? I'll introduce you to Tim."

Andy said, "No, I'm eating xôi with my father."

"Well, I'll see you in school then, okay?"

"Yeah." And Andy watched her socks move away from his view.

Andy grabbed a chunk of xôi. The <u>glutinous</u> rice and beans stuck to his fingernails. He placed the chunk in his mouth and pulled it away from his fingers with his teeth. There was a dry bitter taste. But nothing could be as bitter as he was, so he <u>gnawed</u> some more. The bitterness <u>faded</u> as the xôi became softer in his mouth, but it was still tasteless. He could hear the young couple talk and giggle. Their words and laughter and the sounds of his own chewing mixed into a sticky mess. The words were bitter and the laughter was tasteless, and once he began to <u>apprehend</u> this, he tasted the sweetness of xôi. Andy enjoyed swallowing the sticky mess down. Andy swallowed everything down— sweetness and bitterness and nothingness and what he thought was love.



"If any person showed me kindness or friendship, I would be a hundred times kinder in return. For that one person's sake I would make peace with all people. But that is a hopeless dream. N o human will ever be friends with me. But you, Victor Frankenstein, my creator, can make another creature as ugly as myself, who will accept me and be my companion. You owe me that much."

The small hut that I was staying in was situated on one of the Orkney Islands off the coast of Scotland. It was perfect for my work. I sat one evening on my laboratory thinking. Three years ago I had tried to create a human being. Instead, I had made a monster which murdered my brother and an innocent servant had been **blamed**. Since then I had felt only guilt. A few hours later I heard footsteps outside. Then, the door opened and the thing that I feared most entered. How can I describe how I felt at the sight of him? I had wanted my creation to be beautiful. Beautiful! But he wasn't.

"You destroyed her! You broke your promise to me! You forget that I have power over you. You are my creator but I am your master! Since you deny me love, only revenge remains – revenge, from now on, will be my light and food! I may die, but at first I will hurt you like you hurt me."

"G o away! I do break my promise; never will I create another like yourself, equal in ugliness and wickedness," I shouted.

The monster ran away and a few minutes later I saw him in his boat, which disappeared into the darkness.
